Question of: Addressing the issue of misuse of UN Peacekeeping operations, with special

emphasis on sexual abuse in the missions

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY,

Deeply disturbed by the increasing allegation reports of sexual exploitation and abuse by UN peacekeepers and employees,

A comma is placed at the end of each preambulatory clause.

Keeping in mind that one of the many missions of UN peacekeepers is also to protect civilians,

Guided by the recent reports and operations made by the High-Level Independent Panel on UN Peace Operations (HIPPO) and their outcomes,

1. <u>Suggests</u> the enhancement of the thoroughness of inspections and other supervisory reviews made by the High-Level Independent Panel on UN Peace Operations (HIPPO) by:

If the main body is succeeded by a sub-clause, a colon is placed at the end of the main body.

2.

- a. establishing a sub-division supportive chamber of HIPPO called the Chamber on Sexual Exploitation and Abuse in UN peace Operations (SEAPO Chamber) which will:
 - i. give semiannual reports for misuse in UN peace Operations specifically concerning sexual abuse, assault, exploitation and violence

- ii. hold annual meetings with HIPPO in order to discuss all sexual abuse and exploitation-based allegations which will be added to the review of HIPPO;
- 3. <u>Encourages</u> the UN peacekeeping operation curators and curating organizations to improve the filtering aspects of the UN peacekeeper training and mandate extensive research on candidates beforehand such as but not limited to:
 - a. checking for a criminal record especially regarding sexual crimes
 - b. performing an extensive psychological test to determine whether or not the candidates' mental stability is a threat to the UN peacekeeping policies;

A semi-colon is placed at the end of each operative clause.

The full names of abbreviations should be stated at least once throughout the document.

- 4. <u>Invites</u> the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to co-operate with HIPPO and member states in order to prevent child prostitution and sexual exploitation caused by UN peacekeepers and their operations;
- 5. <u>Decides</u> to remain actively seized of the matter.

A period is placed at the end of the resolution.
